• **Police Rep./C.O.P. – Dave Powers**

Crime in Chartley- 2 crimes reported by our residents during February. The first was a non-domestic assault reported on Feb 14th at 10:37 AM in the 500 blk of Glen Granite Rd, and the 2nd was a theft reported on Feb 15th at 7:45 PM in the 300 blk of Shirley Manor Rd. This brings our YTD total to 5 reported incidents within the community, as compared to 2 for the same period last year.

Note: The assault on Glen Granite Rd resulted from a road rage incident that occurred outside of the community where our resident was cut off but one of the vehicles involved was apparently bumped. The perp followed her home and an altercation ensued. One of the vehicles had some damage to either a tire or the rim. The resident later went to the Precinct and file a police report.

Note: Of the 5 crimes reported so far this year, 3 were non-domestic assaults, which may indicate that we need to be more vigilant whenever we are out and about. **Be aware of your surroundings wherever you are, particularly when you are outside or shopping after dark.**

PCRC Meeting Feb 20, 2024

Capt Jamerson’s report:

- Overall crime in the County was 11% higher in 2023 than it was in 2022
 - Increase in auto theft from 1572 in 2022 to 4456 in 2023 (283% increase in this category alone)
 - Week prior to the PCRC meeting, there were 17 auto thefts reported in Precinct 3 alone. Seven juveniles were involved in these 17 thefts, 3 of which were repeat offenders. One of those repeat offenders was arrested twice in the same week.
 - Motor vehicle theft up 113% countywide in 2023 as compared to 2022
 - Juvenile crime continues to increase throughout the County as well as throughout the nation
 - Shoplifting increased by 70 percent within our Precinct during 2023, jumping from 498 reports in 2022 to 823 in 2023
1. Since January 1st shoplifting is down from the same time last year (117 as of the PCRC meeting), the police are continuing to work closely with merchants to help reduce these numbers as well.
 - Precinct 3 was the only precinct in Baltimore County that did not have any reported homicides last year.
