now have space for Crystal to create a museum displaying all the donations from longtime residents of Reisterstown, space for creative workshops, and storage of all the items needed to hold the great events enjoyed by all.

New Sidewalks in the 200 and 300 block of Main Street make strolling much easier. Reisterstown Main Street worked with Baltimore County DPW to complete this project for our town. The concrete surface for both the sidewalk and driveway aprons will be much safer and with the rows of brick at the curb bringing consistency to the center of town with the northern and southern sections, while continuing to distinguish our historic look in the district. 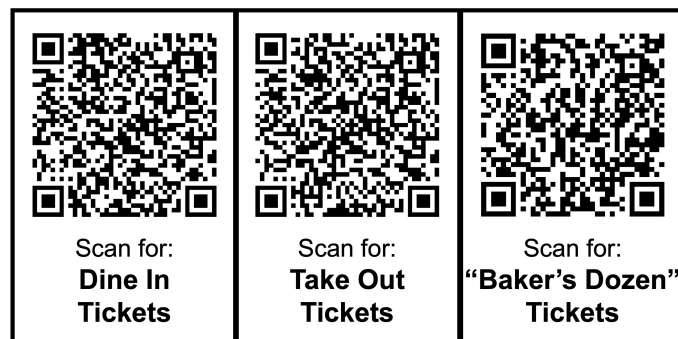

Crime In Chartley

Two more crimes were reported by Chartley residents during August bringing our year-to-date total to 26 as compared to 9 for the same period last year. One of the crimes reported in August was a case of vandalism in the 200 block of Homevale Road and the second was a theft in the 200 Block of Brunk Road. There does not seem to be any patterns associated with any of the crimes reported since the beginning of this year as they have been scattered throughout the community and have been reported at all different times and on varying days of the week. The most prevalent crime reported so far has been Non-Domestic Assault (9), followed by Home Burglaries (5). Most of the Non-Domestic Assault reports appear to be kids on their way to/from school particularly during the January thru April timeframe. And

outside of the usual timeframes for this type of crime which is during the workweek between 10 AM and 2 PM. Nevertheless, as will be noted below, with fall fast approaching, we still must shore up our defenses.

School has now started, so please remember to be watchful for children during the morning and afternoons. Gwynwest Road seems to have become the Chartley Speedway from 7 AM to around 8:30 AM and then again from around 3:45 PM until 5:30 PM. And this is one of the primary walkways for kids going to and from one of the schools within the Chartley footprint. And Chartley Drive is another street that I classify as a speedway. Despite the installation of speed humps and the fact that it is a narrow street, people constantly exceed the speed limit there also. We are asking the police to monitor these situations and to take appropriate action.

During my drives through the community for the past several months, I have noticed an unusually large number of homes that have some seriously overgrown trees or shrubs that obscure windows or doorways to the home. By obscure I mean that these plants are tall enough to allow a burglar to use them as a screen to prevent someone from seeing them as they break into a home. In some cases, these plants completely cover a door or window (in most cases more than one window was blocked). Most of these plants are evergreens so they will not drop their foliage during the fall and winter seasons. This situation is a crime waiting to happen and you can bet the criminal element will take note!

Now that fall is almost here, the daylight hours are getting shorter and shorter. This means that the criminal element will have more nighttime hours to try to make you a crime victim. Shorter daylight hours also make each of us rush faster to get things done before nightfall, which then makes us forgetful and more prone to failing to properly secure our vehicles, homes, and sheds. As we have noted in the past, while we should always continuously assess our defenses against crime, we should take a **detailed assessment** of these defenses at least four times a year...with the changing of each season. So, with the onset of fall, please take a moment and always:

- **Lock it up, each time, every time.**
- **Keep the outside of your house illuminated after dark.**
- **Strongly consider the installation of home security cameras around your property.**
- **Never leave your vehicle running unattended.**
- **Never leave valuables in your vehicles.**
- **Never leave the keys to any property inside your vehicle.**
- **Be aware of your surroundings wherever you are, particularly when you are outside or shopping after dark.**
- **NEVER, EVER, FOR ANY REASON, GIVE ANY PERSONAL INFORMATION WHATSOEVER TO ANYONE UNTIL YOU HAVE VERIFIED THE SOURCE FIRST**
- **If in doubt, let the police check it out!**
- **If you see something, say something! Call 911 each time, every time.**
- **Remember that if you don't call 911, there will not be a police response...no response...no police follow up to prevent further crimes...MAKE THAT CALL, EACH TIME, EVERY TIME. And call 911 even if you do make a mistake and the criminals take advantage of you. Never be too embarrassed to make that call. You could be helping someone else by allowing the police to start closing the ring on the criminals. MAKE THAT CALL!**

Hello Everyone! This month's D.O.D. is about a wonderful spot that may have some folks under a bit of a misapprehension! El Gran Pollo, despite what it sounds like, is not entirely about chicken. True, that's what a friend and I ordered from the

Mill Center location when we recently had dinner there, so that of course is what I can speak of from personal experience ~ and more about that delightful experience in a moment. Please remember, they have many different choices, such as pasta, subs, lamb, Mexican dishes, soups, etc. A truly impressive variety of choices stretches far beyond chicken! My friend and I both recently ordered the quarter chicken combo, which comes with two sides. I ordered dark meat combo for \$11.99, while she ordered the white meat combo for a buck more. Both of our sides were roasted potatoes and creamed spinach. The Peruvian style chicken was juicy and delicious; we were both very impressed, as we were with the delicious sides as well. You order, pay, and pick up your food at the counter, which was easy and fast, and the staff was very friendly. If you prefer table service, you WILL have to sacrifice that at this restaurant. I feel sure though that once you sit down with your meal, you will agree that carrying your own plate will not wear you out, and when you taste this luscious out of this world chicken, you'll agree it was a small price to pay! Their menu and prices are online – look it up and feast your eyes on all the wonderful choices. There are 6 locations in and around Baltimore, the two closest to us is this one at Mill Center (easy walking distance from Giant), and the Reisterstown location at 75 Main Street. El Gran Pollo really is a great place for chicken. Give one of the two convenient locations a try and get ready for some of the most tender chicken you've ever sunk your teeth in to! An important message from the Baltimore County Police Department

In recent months, the Reisterstown, Owings Mills and Glyndon areas have experienced an **increase in thefts from vehicles**. Most parts of Baltimore County have been affected by these crimes of opportunity. The Baltimore County Police Department is actively working to make arrests in these thefts, but we are asking that Baltimore County residents follow the below instructions to help minimize the potential of becoming a victim of theft:



Lock Your Vehicles at ALL Times: Many theft from vehicles can be prevented simply by locking your vehicle at **ALL** times. Often times, thieves go from vehicle to vehicle checking door handles. Do not provide easy access to your vehicle interior.

Keep valuables OUT OF PLAIN SIGHT: Keep all valuables hidden and out of sight. Remove them from the vehicle if possible. Do not leave power cords or other evidence of valuables in plain sight either. Do not wait until you are about to leave your vehicle to hide your valuables, as often times thieves are waiting in parking lots watching and waiting for these opportunities. Don't increase the chances of being a victim!



Use Anti-Theft Devices: If your vehicle is equipped with an anti-theft device, such as an alarm, use it. Secondary locking devices are good options. The use of any deterrent is encouraged.
